Enhancing Cyber Safety on Chromebooks



At Ardtornish, we purposefully selected Chromebooks for our "one on one device" program because their operating system can be configured and managed by the school to maximise cyber safety.

All students who log into their Chromebook at school, using their allocated ARDPS account, can experience safer browsing because Department for Education filters, automatically block inappropriate content within our school internet environment. While these same Department filters do not apply when a student uses their home internet, we have placed configurations and restrictions on each ARDPS account to allow us to investigate cyber issues involving the use of their Chromebook. However, the use of self-created Google accounts on the Chromebooks can negate these configurations and leave a student with an unmanaged and unrestricted internet portal.

The school's ICT Team also regularly reviews how the Chromebooks are being used and continually monitors our network for instances of cyber bullying, misuse or attempts to access inappropriate websites.

In a recent review, we noted that some students had created their own personal Google accounts on their Chromebooks, to give them their own unique login outside of our ARDPS domain. Initially, this practice did not appear to be problematic, however now that we have received a student report of bullying and a parent alert of misuse, originating from such an unmonitored account, we have decided to remove all secondary logins to prevent such an event occurring again.

Cyber safety is strongly promoted in all classrooms and students at Ardtornish are explicitly taught how to use devices responsibly and safely.

If you, as a parent, ever have any concerns about how devices and software are being used, or become aware of any inappropriate behaviours related to their use, please promptly contact the school for advice and support.

A simple thing that all parents can do, to keep their children safer and happier on line, is to only allow them to access appropriate social media sites in line with the recommended age restrictions shown on the accompanying chart.

We implore all families to be vigilant regarding how their children are using the internet. Where possible, only let them use the school ARDPS account and ensure online activity occurs in an open and visually accessible space within the home. **Steve Whitehead – ICT Coordinator.**






All types of School Card applications are now online.

You can access the online forms from any device that gets internet, including mobile devices, such as tablets and smart phones, as well as laptops and computers.

Applying online is easy! Simply follow the steps below

STEP1 Visit sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard

STEP 2 Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.




FOUNDATION MATHS - ROOM 5


In Maths this term students have continued to develop their number skills and explored patterns and patterning in line with the requirements of the Australian Curriculum. They have produced number lines to show that they can write numbers in the correct order and then use their number line to solve problems.

Students observed natural patterns in the environment and copied, described, continued and created patterns with objects, drawings and sounds.

Undertaking hands on activities allows students to use all their senses to develop basic mathematical concepts and to see the link between the manipulation of real objects and the manipulation of mathematical symbols.







Students become proficient at Maths when they engage in fun and challenging tasks that require them to employ their mathematical understandings to solve problems.
