Naplan Information 2018

In 2018 Naplan will be delivered at Ardtornish through an online process for Year 3, 5, and 7 students. All components of the test: numeracy, reading, writing, spelling and grammar and will be undertaken online with the exception of writing for the Year 3's because of their less developed typing skills and speeds.

Students with Chromebooks will use their own devices and undertake the tests using a locked down browser that ensures they cannot access other websites for support or use a spelling checker.

Ardtornish will be doing the NAPLAN tests in Week 3 of Term 2. However, prior to this time a few classes will undertake a technical readiness test on Thursday 22nd March to ensure our school systems are effective.


Future sessions this term include:

Would you like to be a School Volunteer?.. Training dates

If you would like to help out in your child's classroom with transport, camps, in the library or canteen etc. please collect a Volunteers Pack' from the front office.

It is mandatory to attend a training session as part of being a registered volunteer.

Every volunteer also needs to be RAN Trained, which is covered in this training session.

You only ever need to attend once unless there is a change to the course, which you will then be notified about.

RAN stands for Responding to Abuse and Neglect. The RAN training for volunteers induction session outlines for volunteers their child protection responsibilities and provides guidelines on protective practices. You will receive a RAN Certificate after completing this training session.


When you click FINISH, your interview timetable will be emailed to you automatically. If you do not receive your email immediately -Check your junk mail folder AND make sure you have spelled your email


